SUNY Chancellor's Award for Student Excellence

SYMBOLS AND MEANINGS

The Presidential Medallion

The medallion worn by the President at commencement and official occasions is an emblem of office and symbol of the authority vested in him/her as the President.

The face of the medallion bears Herkimer County Community College's corporate seal. In 1967, Herkimer College's first President, Robert McLaughlin, sponsored a contest among Herkimer County high school students to create a college seal. The winning design concept, submitted by Marie Johnson of Frankfort, was completed and executed by Bronson Quackenbush. His finished design was put on a brass plate by Casimer Rakowski of SUNY Farmingdale, hung from a green and white ribbon, and worn for the first few years until the current medallion was made.

Today's medallion bears the seal with the words "Herkimer County Community College" in green lettering on a gold background in a circular design. The center of the seal reads "State University of New York" around the edges of a triangular shape. Inside the triangle is a drawing of General Herkimer, representing the College's location. The upper right-hand corner bears an open book with a quill, representing learning and knowledge, in front of a world globe. The date on the seal, 1966, is the year Herkimer County Community College was founded. The medallion hangs from a chain of office, with the names of all those who have served as Herkimer County Community College's president engraved on the links. It serves as a tribute to them.

The Ceremonial Mace

A university's mace is carried before the president or chancellor and platform-party dignitaries during commencement and inaugural and other academic ceremonial processions. The mace serves its vital role as the object vested with the power of the institution.

The mace was a gift to the institution from the College's fourth president, Dr. Cathleen C. McColgin, and her husband Robert McColgin, in recognition of the College's 50th anniversary. The College's 49th Commencement on May 19, 2017 was the first academic ceremony at which the mace was carried. Herkimer College's mace is crafted from American black cherry wood harvested from the campus property near the nature trail. Designed and crafted by **George** and **Theresa Olsen** of Richmondville,

NY, the mace features the official college seal, cast in bronze, on each of the four sides. A cage-type finial showcases a beautiful Herkimer Diamond, a double-terminated quartz crystal found in Herkimer, New York and donated by Gems Along the Mohawk.

Academic Regalia

Gowns recommended for use in the colleges and universities of this country have the following characteristics. The gown for the bachelor's degree has pointed sleeves. It is designed to be worn closed. The gown for the master's degree has an oblong sleeve, open at the wrist, like the others. The sleeve base hangs down in the traditional manner. The rear part of its oblong shape is square cut and the front part has an arc cut away. The gown is so designed and supplied with fasteners that it may be worn open or closed. The gown for the doctor's degree has bell-shaped sleeves. For the doctor's degree, the gown is faced down the front with black velvet; three bars of velvet are used across the sleeves. These facings and crossbars may be of velvet of the color distinctive of the disciplines to which the degree pertains, thus agreeing in color with the binding or edging of the hood appropriate to the particular doctor's degree in every instance.

The hoods are to be lined with the official color or colors of the college or university conferring the degree; more than one color is shown by division of the field color in a variety of ways, chevron or chevrons, equal division, etc. Mortarboards are generally recommended. A long tassel is to be fastened to the middle point of the top of the cap only and to lie as it will thereon. The tassel should be black or the color appropriate to the subject, with the exception of the doctor's cap that may have a tassel of gold.

Only members of the governing body of a college or university, whatever their degrees, are entitled to wear doctor's gowns (with black velvet), but their hoods may be only those of degrees actually held by the wearers or those especially prescribed for them by the institution.

Members of religious orders may suitably wear their customary habits. The same principle applies to persons wearing military uniforms or clad in special attire required by a civil office.
